STUDENT ACTIVITY INSTRUCTIONS

Materials Needed:

- Video Link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=LxDqLzUtVLw
- Greater Prairie-Chicken Fact Sheet
- Notebook
- Pen or Pencil
- Blank Drawing Paper
- Colored pencils, markers, or crayons

Preparation Instructions:

- 1. Watch the Prairie Chicken portion (from 1:10 to 2:13) of the video by the Missouri Dept. of Conservation: Nature's Calling Walleye Fishing, Prairie Chickens and Badgers. Link above.
- 2. After watching the video clip, read through the Greater Prairie- Chicken Fact Sheet to learn even more about these birds to complete the activity.

Activity Instructions:

- 1. Answer the following questions in your notebook:
 - a. What are the essential habitat components for the Greater Prairie- Chicken? In other words, what does the Greater Prairie- Chicken NEED from its habitat to survive and reproduce?
 - i. Note: Be specific. How much space do they need for this? What kinds of plant vegetation are needed? Give numbers when possible.
 - b. Fill in the blank. The "Booming Grounds" of the Greater Prairie-Chicken could also be called the ______.
- 2. Now it is time to use your new knowledge and get creative! Design your own ideal Greater Prairie- Chicken habitat. Draw a detailed picture or map of your habitat design. Label all necessary components that you listed above. Use color if you like and have fun!
